- 6. **Enhance Visibility and Capacity**: Increase the operational effectiveness and relevance of liberation movements in modern African governance.

# **Participants and Keynote Speakers**

The summit will host approximately2 00delegates:

- Liberation Movements: Delegations from ANC, MPLA, FRELIMO, SWA-PO, CCM, and ZANU- PF, with each movement bringing 20 delegates and 10 support staff.
  - **Observer Organizations** : Representativesfrom, PAWO, YWoA and PYU.



- **Observer Sister Parties** : Polisario Front, FLN, BNF, and BDP, with two representatives each.
- Invited Ambassadors: Zimbabwe, Angola, Tanzania, Mozambique, Algeria, Western Sahara, and Botswana.

Keynote Speakers include President CyrilRamaphosa, who will address regional stability and prosperity, followed by speeches from the Presidents of MPLA, FRELIMO, SWAPO, CCM, and ZANU-PF. Elder statesmen Thabo Mbeki and Joaquim Chissano will share insights during the Formal Dinner, providing historical perspectives and future directions for liberation movements.
